Ganko Takasegawa Nijo-en

Takasegawa Genryu Teien
(Garden located at the upstream of the Takasegawa River)

The flow of the Takasegawa River, which has attracted people in Kyoto since ancient times, passes through "Ganko Takasegawa Nijo-en", the former villa of the wealthy merchant Ryo Suminokura, and reappears after running under the Kiyamachi Street.

After the garden was established by Ryo in 1611, it became the villa called "Dai-ni Murinan" of Aritomo Yamagata, one of the Genkun of Meiji (the statesmen who contributed in Meiji Restoration). It was then used as the villa of Koichiro Kawada, the 3rd Governor of the Bank of Japan, and owned by Ichitaro Abe. At the present time, it is inherited by the Oiwa family and now used as "Ganko Takasegawa Nijo-en".



At Ganko Takasegawa Nijo-en, located near the conference venue, you can enjoy meals in a traditional house steeped in history. The collaboration of the natural river and Japanese garden visible from the windows represents Japanese aesthetics, ensuring you will experience Japan using all five senses.
